Additionally, the Florida SBDC at FIU, in collaboration with the FIU Chaplin School of Hospitality and Tourism Management, introduced a new training initiative—a 13-webinar series titled "From

Kitchen to Concierge," which focused on business growth strategies for entrepreneurs in the food industry.

One of the standout workshops was "Start Up, Start Right," which guided me through essential steps like incorporating my business and effectively marketing myself on Instagram and other social media platforms.

I've also gained the confidence to step into bigger environments, such as the Starfield Five events and various networking events in Miami and Broward. This year, I plan to participate in more pop-up events and focus on expanding my brand throughout the city. I now feel much more confident and prepared to showcase my business.

From the Owner:

I have a couple of pieces of advice. First, keep going and believe in yourself. Being an entrepreneur isn't easy—there are a lot of bumps in the road. Sometimes you'll be profitable right away, but other times, you might need to rely on a primary job to support your side hustle.
