CHAPLIN SCHOOL OF HOSPITALITY & TOURISM MANAGEMENT

Throughout the years, Florida International University's Chaplin School of Hospitality & Tourism Management has been distinguished as one of the top hospitality programs in the United States. More than 2,000 undergraduate and graduate students from across the nation and around the world choose FIU for its outstanding reputation, advantageous campus locations, expert faculty, rich curriculum, and fast-track career opportunities in the international hotel, food service, and tourism industries. In August 2006, FIU unveiled the first American hospitality and tourism school in Tianjin, China. The Marriott Tianjin China Program is FIU's largest international program, with a capacity for up to 1,000 students.

To ensure the students' success in the program, the Chaplin School offers abundant resources in several key areas:

Scholarship Support

The Chaplin School awards nearly \$700,000 in scholarships to students annually. Funds are made possible through generous partnerships with hospitality organizations.

Faculty Active in Industry

Faculty value student exploration and encourage innovation. They serve as mentors and models, who challenge and inspire students.

Dedicated Career Services

Students and alumni, both benefit from an in-house career center, the J. Willard and Alice S. Marriott Foundation Career Development Program helps students to make the connection between academic experience and a professional career.

Flexible Study Options

Students may enroll in online and on-site programs for both, bachelor or master level. The school offers an accelerated Master of Science in Hospitality Management that can be completed in as little as 10 months.

Experiential Learning

Events like the Food Network & Cooking Channel South Beach Wine & Food Festival presented by FOOD & WINE and behind the scenes tours at some of South Florida's largest companies give students robust experiences in the industry.

State-of-the-Art Facilities

Learning laboratories at the Chaplin Schools, such as the Wine Spectator Restaurant Management Laboratory, have been specifically outfitted to give students hands-on experience and motivate entrepreneurship and innovation.

SCHOOL OF ENVIRONMENT ARTS AND SOCIETY (SEAS)

An integral part of the College of Arts, Sciences & Education, the School of Environment, Arts and Society (SEAS)'s mission is to ensure the long-term health and well-being of the planet and its societies through inspirational teaching and stimulating creative works, as well as groundbreaking research and global community engagement. With more than 140 core faculty in the departments of Biological Sciences, Earth and Environment, and English, SEAS offers undergraduate, graduate and combined degrees and undergraduate and graduate certificates. SEAS houses several programs, centers and institutes, including the Sea Level Solutions Center (SLSC), Tropical Conservation Institute (TCI), Institute of Water and Environment, International Center for Tropical Botany (ICTB), and Center for the Humanities in an Urban Environment (CHUE). SEAS faculty and students have access to world class facilities at FIU such as Aquarius Reef Base, the world's only operating undersea laboratory, through the Medina Aquarius Program. Our researchers also have access to the Kampong, one of only five gardens in the

National Tropical Botanical Garden (NTBG) and the only mainland-U.S. facility, located in Coconut Grove, Florida through ITCB. SEAS faculty and students also lead Everglades restoration efforts through the Florida Coastal Everglades Long Term Ecological Research (FCE-LTER) program.

In addition, SEAS offers exposure through community partnerships to organizations including Fairchild Tropical Botanical Garden, Deering Estate at Cutler, Zoo Miami, and the Patricia & Phillip Frost Museum of Science. Partnerships with local cultural institutions further allow students to engage with the humanities, whether art, music, history, literature, religion or language, in unique ways. SEAS has also developed innovative and exciting educational experiences for K-12 students used in and out of the classroom worldwide. SEAS features a nationally recognized Agroecology Program that trains high school and university students in sustainable agriculture, and the FCE-LTER Schoolyard that provides projects and lessons for K-12 students. The school's EcoAcademy Summer Camp brings 6-14 year-old students to FIU every summer for marine science activities, arts and crafts, swimming and kayaking.
