

FAU, FTU scholarship winners announced at Memorial Ceremony

Florida Atlantic University and a Florida International University student each recently received the \$1,000 Penny Sult Memorial Scholarship from the Construction Financial Management Association (CFMA) of South Florida. The scholarships were presented at the general meeting by the organization's south Florida Chapter President, William Steinmetz, who is vice president/secretary of Roepnack Corporation, general contractors headquartered in Pompano Beach.

Qualifying students must have a minimum of 75 credit hours in accounting, have at least a 3.0 GPA and be a junior, senior, or graduate full-time student.

The scholarship is given in honor of Penny Sult, a well-known and respected member of CFMA for many years until her untimely death as a result of a horse riding accident. Members of CFMA established the scholarship fund as a way to honor Penny's years of service and involvement in the organization.

Jeremy Hurwrich was the FAU recipient of the scholarship. Jeremy, a senior in the Accounting Scholars Program in

the Barry Kaye College of Business at Florida Atlantic University is serving as President of the Beta Alpha Psi Chapter at the University. He is currently a teacher's assistant at the university, conducts labs for the Principles of Financial Accounting classes, and has maintained a 4.0 GPA during his undergraduate studies.

He plans to attend FAU for his masters in accounting. Recently, Jeremy helped to organize the Inaugural School of Accounting Celebration, securing \$36,000 in scholarships for FAU's accounting students. He is active in his community and his church and has organized yearly food drives during the holiday season.

Jonathan Morera was the FTU scholarship winner. Jonathan is working toward his bachelor's of accounting degree at FIU while working as a real estate sales associate and an information and data controller and maintaining a 3.3 GPA.

In addition to his full scholastic and work schedules, Jonathan served as president-elect of Beta Alpha Psi during the fall semester.

He organized and produced a two-weekend, 24-hour CPE program for South Florida CPAs and handled all the arrangements and logistical details including securing speakers, outlines, bios, and facilities. ■
