Malcolm Butters Selected to FIU Hall of Fame

Founder of Butters Construction & Development Recognized for Entrepreneurship

Malcolm Butters, the co-founder and president of Coconut Creek, FL-based Butters Construction & Development Inc., will be inducted Thursday into the Florida International University Entrepreneurship Hall of Fame.

The distinction honors alumni of the College of Business Administration at Florida International University for new business enterprises.

Malcolm Butters founded the development, property management and leasing company in 1990 with his brother, Mark Butters. The firm has developed more than 10 million square feet over the past 18 years and was named Developer of the Year three times by the South Florida chapter of NAIOP.

The firm's current development projects include the 650,000-square-foot Pompano Center of Commerce in Pompano Beach; a 300,000-square-foot distribution center for RREEF in Medley; and two office projects -- Boca Village Executive Center and Boca Village Corporate Center -- totaling 265,000 square feet in Boca Raton.

Malcolm Butters earned a Masters in real estate in 1983 at Florida International University.
